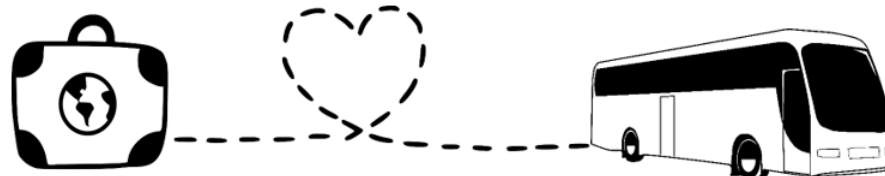

# More Details About Each Place

## **Gone with the Wind Remembered Museum**



### **NO OTHER COLLECTION IS QUITE LIKE THIS ONE**

The *Gone With The Wind* Remembered Museum is a not-for-profit company. It contains one of the most comprehensive and extensive collections of *GWTW* memorabilia in the world. Vicky Lynn Rogers has been collecting these items for over 30 years. There are a number of original one-of-a-kind pieces as well as items that are extremely rare including one of the most iconic costume pieces from the movie, the mourning bonnet worn by Scarlett O'Hara.

The museum is a state of the art, climate controlled, specially lighted and spacious facility.

As the world renowned film nears its 80th Anniversary, book and movie fans alike are able to journey back in time and experience the history of a civil war novel that was published in 43 languages and in 53 countries, and a movie that changed filmmaking for all time.

All over the world, the book and film have influenced peoples' ideas about southern history. We hope you will reminisce with us and savor what you see.

## **Chisholm Trail Outdoor Museum**

The Chisholm Trail Outdoor Museum sits on the Chisholm Trail which was a trail used in the late 19th century to drive cattle overland. The museum includes a life size cattle drive silhouettes, Johnson County's original courthouse, a working blacksmith shop, a one room school house, a stagecoach station, teepees, and more.

The Big Bear Native American Museum featuring a collection of Native American artifacts donated by Leonard "Big Bear" Beal and additional artifacts supplement his collection to provide a complete overview of Native Americans in North America from their arrival over 13,000 years ago to the present.



## Magnolia Market at the Silos

Magnolia Market at the Silos, commonly called Magnolia Market, is a shopping complex that encompasses two city blocks in downtown Waco, Texas. It is marked by two 120' high silos, built in 1950 as part of the Brazos Valley Cotton Oil Company.<sup>[6]</sup> The Brazos Valley Cotton Oil Mill Company closed in 1958, and the silos ceased to serve as storage in the 1990s.<sup>[6]</sup> The grounds opened to the public in October, 2015.<sup>[7]</sup> The complex is owned by Chip and Joanna Gaines, TV personalities best known for HGTV's "*Fixer Upper*" TV series. The Gaineses completely transformed the Waco landmark, which helped to change the city as well as many surrounding areas.



The grounds include a 12,000 sq. ft. retail store located in the historic grain barn and office building, a food truck park with picnic tables, a garden store, bakery, and lawn area. Admission to the grounds is free except during special events.<sup>[8]</sup>

In 2016, its first full year of operation, Magnolia Market reported an estimated 1.9 million visitors.<sup>[9]</sup> Special events are held regularly at the complex, including Spring at the Silos (March), Silobration (October), and Christmas at the Silos.<sup>[10]</sup> Events include concerts, vendor booths, and other activities.

In 2019, it was announced that Magnolia Market is undergoing a \$10.4 million expansion.<sup>[11]</sup> The expansion plans include adding new shops and public spaces to the two-block area anchored by the Silos.<sup>[12]</sup> Attractions include a whiffle ball field, more shops, and gardens, as well as the relocation of the historic Waco Church to the 4.9-acre site. Magnolia Market Complex already draws an estimated 30,000 visitors per week.

## Dr Pepper Museum



The Dr Pepper Museum & Free Enterprise Institute opened to the public in May 1991 and has hosted over 1,700,000 visitors. It is located in Waco, Texas and is the home of the Nation's oldest major soft drink.

The Museum is housed in the 1906 Artesian Manufacturing and Bottling Company building located in downtown Waco. The 100 year-old building is listed in the National Register of Historic Places as the "Home of Dr Pepper." The Museum receives the support of Keurig Dr Pepper and its affiliated bottlers but is not owned or operated by them.

Located at the corner of Fifth Street and Mary Avenue in the turn of the century manufacturing district, the vacant bottling plant was in a sad state of repair in a neighborhood comprised mostly of abandoned warehouses that was officially declared as "blighted" by the City. The Waco Chamber of Commerce and the City of Waco hoped that the Museum would be a catalyst for renewed energy and growth in the area, with the potential for restaurants and shops in the old warehouses down the street similar to the "West End" district in Dallas.

Dr Pepper Company donated the historic building to the nonprofit organization in 1988. Renovation began in the summer of 1990. The building formally opened to the public on May 11, 1991. At that time, only a small portion of the ground level was open to the public. During the next six years, the Museum embarked on three additional construction phases until the entire building was restored and opened in May 1997.

Built in 1908, it is an iconic 30,000 square foot landmark that still possesses the signature long-leaf pine beams separating each of the shops. Many a customer has said that the old wood itself lends an aroma that makes people feel as if they have "come home" upon their arrival.

## Armstrong Browning Library & Museum

The Armstrong Browning Library & Museum is dedicated to the study of the lives and works of Victorian poets Robert and Elizabeth Barrett Browning and houses the world's largest collection of Browning material and other fine collections of rare 19th-century books, manuscripts, and works of art.



## Homestead Craft Village



Homestead Heritage Traditional Crafts Village is at 608 Dry Creek Rd. A working farm and craft village includes a blacksmith forge, gristmill, fiber craft shop, woodworking shop, general store, grocery store, cheese shop and pottery shop; most shops offer demonstrations. Classes are held in gardening, homesteading, animal husbandry, canning, soap making, breadmaking, cheese making, pottery, blacksmithing and hand-tool woodworking.

## Waco Mammoth National Monument

Standing as tall as 14 feet and weighing 20,000 pounds, Columbian mammoths roamed across what is present-day Texas thousands of years ago. Today, the fossil specimens represent the nation's first and only recorded evidence of a nursery herd of ice age Columbian mammoths. It all started with a discovery in 1978.
